Department of Early Childhood Transition Planning: Supporting Multilingual Learners (MLLs)

Workgroup Charter

Purpose

In collaboration with and in support of the development of the new agency, this workgroup will develop specific recommendations to align and improve early childhood services, programs, and supports for multilingual learners, their families, and the practitioners who support them.

This workgroup will have an intentional focus on

- Identifying multilingual learners consistently across programs;
- Providing appropriate linguistic and cultural supports for children in early childhood programs (e.g., professional development); and
- Creating recommendations for seamless transitions from early childhood to K-12 for multilingual learners and their families.

Background Information

Illinois is committed to providing equitable access and opportunities to all children in early childhood programs (and beyond). Starting in Spring 2024, the Transition Team will launch a workgroup to build on the 2021 Funding Commission report and other pertinent resources to develop recommendations for future priorities, program alignment, and improvement for multilingual learners, their families, and those who support and provide care in their communities.

Goals & Objectives

- 1. To understand the current landscape, context, plans, and recommendations for programs serving multilingual children and families
 - a. Determine which programs and services are relevant to multilingual learners and families
 - b. Determine guardrails for workgroup (in scope/out of scope)
 - c. Document current context, lessons learned from other states, and implications for new agency
- 2. To prepare and present recommendations for programs and the new agency that centers multilingual children, families, and practitioners
 - a. Center and document family ideas for program connections and alignment
 - b. Explore recommendations with families and communities furthest from opportunity, advocacy organizations, state agencies, LEAs, intermediaries, legislators, and others identified
 - c. Finalize recommendations and share with the state agencies, TAC, ELC, IACBE, and other groups as needed

Outcomes & Deliverables

Create a child, family, and community-friendly set of recommendations, centered in equity and civil rights, that

- aligns to identified family needs and solutions,
- meets federal and state requirements,
- attends to feasibility and sustainability, and
- supports agency and administration mission, vision, and values.
