

TAC Charge

The state has established the **Transition Advisory Committee (TAC)**, comprised of representatives with diverse perspectives from across the state, to serve as an external advisory committee as the state moves toward a single ECE agency.

The TAC will seek and help the state make meaning of stakeholder input in preparation for the transition, with a particular emphasis on understanding families' goals and needs from a comprehensive ECE system for Illinois children.


The Transition Advisory Committee will work with the State's Early Childhood Transition Director, Ann Whalen, to **release a report by December 31, 2025**.



- Document **national best practices** and position Illinois to be a leader among data-driven collaboratives in the national early childhood sector.
- Generally promote a data and learning culture throughout the early childhood system.






Setting the stage for our work: Stakeholder Engagement Meaning Making

State Budgeting Process Overview and FY25 Budget Planning




State Budget Process Overview



The Illinois Constitution requires the Governor to prepare and submit a state budget to the General Assembly for the upcoming fiscal year.


Illinois Fiscal Year (FY) is July 1 – June 30 (e.g., FY24 is July 1, 2023 – June 30, 2024)

State Budget Process Overview



*By May 31 the GA can pass a budget with a majority vote, but after May 31, in the month of June prior to the beginning of the fiscal year on July 1, it will require a supermajority to pass the budget.

The transition will be over a multi-year timeline, allowing for multiple opportunities to provide recommendations on the state budget
